NARRATIVE:

Burlington Police are investigating several incidents involving a male suspect grabbing women inappropriately while they were outside walking. In early December a female walking on South Prospect St. in the early morning was touched inappropriately on the outside of her clothing. A few minutes later, a female running on Shelburne Rd. near Home Ave. reported that a male matching the description of the suspect on South Prospect touched her inappropriately in the same manner. The suspect in the December incidents was described as a white male, between 5'8" and 5'10", thin build wearing a hooded jacket with red on it. During both incidents the suspect fled on foot after touching the females.

In January there have been three incidents during which females were touched inappropriately on the outside of their clothing by a male suspect who fled the scene on foot after the incidents. One incident occurred at night on Pearl St. and the others were in the early morning hours on Colchester Ave. and Pearl St. The suspect in the January incidents was described as a white male wearing a white winter jacket with a hood in his 20's with a thin build.

Four of the five victims were walking alone. All but one of the reported incidents occurred between 6:00am and 7:00am.

The Police urge all citizens to be aware of their surroundings while walking or running and avoid being distracted by listening to music or talking on a cell

phone, especially at night. If possible walk or run with someone and in well lighted and populated areas.

If you are approached and touched inappropriately while out walking or running scream loudly for someone to call the Police or 911 and continue making as much noise as possible. Do not delay calling the Police if you have a cell phone. Or, call as soon as possible from the nearest phone. Even if you are not injured in the incident, call the Police immediately.
