Important Information About Burlington Regulations

CARS

1. PARKING ON A LAWN OR OTHER GRASSY AREA IS PROHIBITED

- Parking on lawns, yards, walkways, greenbelts* and right-of-ways is prohibited by City Ordinance.
- Preservation of green areas like lawns and greenbelts helps to beautify our neighborhoods, muffle noise, clean the air, slow down stormwater, provide a healthy environment and keep Lake Champlain clean.
- Vehicles in violation are subject to towing and fines.

COUCHES

2. KEEPING UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE ON THE PORCHES IS PROHIBITED

- Furniture not constructed for outdoor use may <u>not</u> be stored or kept on porches or in plain view in the front yard of any property.
- City ordinances also prohibit outdoor (porch or yard) storage of many items, including accumulations of recycling, furniture, cabinets, sinks or toilets, lumber or construction materials.
- Violations are subject to tickets and fines.

TRASH

3.FURNITURE ON THE GREENBELT* AND FRONT YARD TRASH ARE PROHIBITED

- Per City Ordinances, you may not leave trash, recycling or furniture on the greenbelt, in the yard, or on the porch.
- Neatly contained recycling and covered trash containers may only remain outdoors for the day of pickup. Items for pickup left for more than 24 hours must be stored out of sight at the rear or exterior, and may not be stored indefinitely.
- It is the property owner and residents' responsibility to keep the greenbelt* clean and neat.
- Code Enforcement conducts regular patrols. Violations are subject to tickets and fines.

^{*}Greenbelt is a grassy area located between the sidewalk and road.
